YRDSB Chair Lynn outlined that in order to pass new Education Development Charge By-Laws, the Boards are proposing to each enact successor Education Development Charge By-Laws, and as part of the process are conducting a review of their Education Development Charge policies by conducting both public meetings as part of the process of passing the new EDC By-Laws. The Boards were seeking input from the public and would give consideration to the submissions received prior to passing Education Development Charges By-Laws. The primary purpose was to provide a source of funding for new school sites as they are not funded by a per pupil grant under the Province's funding model.

YCDSB Vice-Chair lafrate advised that the Boards reviewed their Education Development Charge policies, received and reviewed the background study relating to the proposed successor by-laws. It was noted that the purpose of the meeting was to allow the Boards to receive further information about the proposed by-laws in order to consider passage.

YRDSB Chair, R. Lynn invited J. Ammendolia from Watson & Associates to present.

Mr. Ammendolia's presentation included the following topics:

- What is an Education Development Charge?
- Policy Review Public Meetings provincial legislation dictates that each school board with an existing EDC by-law must conduct a review of its EDC policies prior to renewing their EDC by-law.
- EDC Policies policy decisions made by the Board can play a key role in determining things like areas to which the bylaw applies; the ability to have different charges for different types of housing developments or how much of the eventual charge is to be borne by residential or non-residential development.
- A review of existing policies

York Catholic District School Board Vice-Chair M. lafrate introduced J. Easto of Keel Cottrelle LLP. Mr. Easto provided an overview of the by-laws and stated that the two bylaws for both Boards are identical except for the change in by-law numbers and that the Catholic Board has the uniform charge throughout the term. It was noted that the by-laws have a five-year term, which is the maximum term. Both school boards have to pass new by-laws prior to July 1, 2024 in order to collect EDCs on building
